I wanted to provide you an update following our email to you in March (copy attached) regarding the public safety adjacent to one of the seating areas on Burnham Town Front.

We have now finalised a design for kee-klamp to be positioned on top of the brick work and I attach a basic sketch and annotation showing this. This design ensures the kee-klamp can be fixed as securely as possible to the brick, maximising its stability and therefore public safety. The kee-klamp will be in a black enamel to improve its aethetics compared with the standard bare steel.

The works are likely to take 5 days and we would need to block off the seating area whilst these works are undertaken and propose we erect heras fencing around the seating area to isolate the working area. We would also erecting fact sheets on the fencing so the public understand what we are doing. I would be grateful if you could let me know if you are happy for us to proceed on this basis.








#### Kee-klamp Railings at Burnham-on-Crouch

I write to you regarding the recent installation of the kee-klamp safety railings we have installed along Burnham Town Front.

Following complaints we have received from members of the public regarding this installation, we wanted to clarify our position alongside providing you with background information and context.

We undertake routine public safety inspections of all the assets we maintain. Following a number of observations of children climbing on the tidal defence in front of the raised seating area, we identified the structure as being a public safety risk.

Risk assessment is dynamic and it changes over time depending on observation and knowledge giving us new information. In this case it may not have been an identified risk for a number of years but human behaviour and interaction with the environment changes over time and this is an example of new information identifying a safety risk.

The edge protection of the existing wall due to the raised platforms was of a concerning height. The introduction of the railings raises the edge protection height.

We notified Burnham Town Council raising our concerns and advising they take appropriate action in 2018, however they stated they did not believe they own the structure. We did not wish to leave a public safety risk unaddressed and therefore as we maintain this flood defence asset we took the decision to act to minimise the safety risk and as a temporary safety measure we installed warning signs.

In March 2020 we sent a letter to a councillor at Burnham Town Council stating although we do not own the area, we can use our permissive powers to provide a more permanent safety measure.

Consequently kee-klamp railing has been installed, which is a recognised public safety structure providing edge protection and is not a solid structure that might prevent the view from the seating area altogether. We considered black enamel was preferable to improve the aesthetics compared to the standard bare steel rails.

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In June 2020 we sent an email to Burnham Town Council detailing the work we planned to undertake, including a description and sketch of the kee-klamp railing design. We asked the council if they were happy for us to proceed and whether they needed more detail. The council responded with written acknowledgement of the design and did not raise any concerns or requirement of any further information. We assumed the Town Council to be representing and notifying the local residents on the matter.

In January 2021 we provided Burnham Town Council with a date that we would start the works.

Based on our correspondence with you in 2020 and 2021, we therefore had an understanding that the Town Council were in agreement with our work and were not aware of there being any outstanding objections.

It is not our intention to create difficulties within the local community, however our priority is to address the risk to public safety.

Please let me know if you would like copies of the correspondence I refer to above.

I hope this has provided you with the information you require for any internal discussions you may have. Thank you for the invitation to attend a council meeting, but in this instance we will be declining the invitation. If you require any further information prior to your discussions or subsequently then please contact us.

At the last Burnham on Crouch Town Council meeting, I was asked to write to you to place onrecord the disappointment with the design and approach of the Environment Agency when placing the Kee-Klamp on the sea wall at Burnham on Crouch

Burnham Residents are not happy with the installation, whilst the email received from the Environment Agency was "NOTED" by Burnham Town Council, the acknowledgment sent from Burnham Town Council did not equate to consultation or acceptance of works to be carried out.

I have been asked that the Environment Agency provide the paper trail to support their claim of Burnham Town Council's support, as to date, this has not been received.

Correspondence was exchanged with the Conservation Officer at Maldon District Council and the Environment Agency following public safety concerns. Burnham Town Council were consulted and approved the railings design on the understanding that the railings would be placed on top of the wall. Following investigation by EA the wall was deemed not strong enough for the railings to go on top,. This investigation report was not given to Burnham Town Council.

The Town Council also ask why, if the railings need to be placed on the sea wall for Health & safety reasons, then can't the railings be put on the other side of the wall?

In the light of this problem may the Town Council please ask that a proposal to look for an alternative railing design with input from Maldon District Council Conservation Officer and Burnham Town Council be considered.

This part of the sea wall is in a Conservation Area and had a homeowner carried out such works of this nature, they would be in serious trouble.

Furthermore, by placing the railings where they are it now causes an increased Health and Safety issue by installing these railings.

The Town Council agrees that the following information,

- An email was received on 9/3/2020 detailing permissive powers under Health and Safety.
- 16/6/2020 A Risk Assessment was sent to Burnham Town Council, this was noted by Burnham Town Council, a further email was received January 2021.

Thank you for your email dated 4 March 2020 regarding the ownership of the quay area in Burnham-on-Crouch and the installation of a handrail on the tidal defences there.

I can confirm that it is not us but the Local Authority who own this area. Under the Water Resources Act 1991 and the Land Drainage Act 1991 (as amended by the Flood and Water Management Act 2010) the Environment Agency is granted a number of powers to require certain works to be undertaken by riparian owners and also to undertake its own works in relation to its flood risk management function on designated Main River watercourses. The powers for the Environment Agency to undertake work to assist the landowner are however discretionary, a "permissive" in nature and the Environment Agency has no duty to undertake such works, nor to maintain or repair works once constructed.

We are planning to use these permissive powers to undertake Health and Safety works on the tidal flood defences along the quay in Burnham-on-Crouch as highlighted by a Public Safety Risk Assessment we have had carried out which is attached to this email.

 Burnham Residents are not happy with the installation, whilst the email received from the Environment Agency was "NOTED" by Burnham Town Council, the acknowledgment sent from Burnham Town Council did not equate to consultation or acceptance of works to be carried out. I have been asked that the Environment Agency provide the paper trail to support their claim of Burnham Town Council's support, as to date, this has not been received.

This information has been provided in our emails sent to on 2 March 2021 and 15 March 2021.

2. Burnham Town Council were consulted and approved the railings design on the understanding that the railings would be placed on top of the wall. Following investigation by EA the wall was deemed not strong enough for the railings to go on top,. This investigation report was not given to Burnham Town Council.

Our email to office@burnhamtowncouncil.com on 23 June 2020 included drawings showing the finalised design for the Kee-Klamp railings. This shows that the Kee-Klamp railings were to be placed on the landward side of the seawall.

- 3. The Town Council also ask why, if the railings need to be placed on the sea wall for Health & safety reasons, then can't the railings be put on the other side of the wall?
  - For the same reasons that the Kee-Klamp railings could not be placed on top of the seawall, it could not be placed on the seaward side of the seawall due to stability.
- 4. In the light of this problem may the Town Council please ask that a proposal to look for an alternative railing design with input from Maldon District Council Conservation Officer and Burnham Town Council be considered.

I would highlight that we did consider aesthetics and chose black enamel railings to match what is already there. We have also been in correspondence with Burnham Town Council multiple times in the last year and in particular June 2020, when we provided drawings and a description of what we were proposing to install. We invited the Town Council's comments and response before we ordered materials. However, we would welcome suggestions for a low cost alternative design.

5. Furthermore by placing the railings where they are it now causes an increased Health and Safety issue by installing these railings.

Kee-Klamp railings are a recognised public safety measure which provide edge protection. In addition to this, there is signage in place advising the public to keep off the wall and of the sudden drop beyond the sea wall. As stated in our previous email correspondence with Burnham Town Council, we intend to amend the signage to include that children must be supervised at all times. These public safety measures have been considered appropriate by our public safety risk assessor. We have since had the location peer reviewed independently by two other assessors and they are in agreement with the measures we have installed.


